A **Snow Emergency** may be declared by the City Manager when snow or ice, or combination thereof interferes with the proper removal of accumulated snow and ice from any city streets, highways or city owned parking lots. (Ord. No. 393.14, 1-6-15)

Within 12 hours of declaring a Snow Emergency, parking is prohibited on ALL STREETS and in CITY OWNED PARKING LOTS within the City of Hudson. The City Owned Parking Lots are located:

- between Lane and N. Church
- between N. Church and N. Market
- between S. Church and S. Market

Those vehicles remaining on city streets or in city parking lots may be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense. If you do not have a driveway, you will need to move your vehicle into your yard or make other arrangements for the duration of the Snow Emergency.

Everyone who has a sidewalk will have 12 hours to clear them of snow and ice after cessation.



The State of Michigan prohibits anyone to deposit snow, ice, or slush onto any roadway or highway.

(Ord. No. 264, § 4.57, 11-12-84; Ord. No. 380, 5-6-0808)



Snowmobile Rules

- May not operate upon the land of another without their consent
- May not operate on the City Trails, within Maple Grove Cemetery, a public or private parking lot, or within 100 feet of a sledding, skiing or skating area
- May not pass within 100 feet of a dwelling between midnight and 6 a.m. at greater than minimal speed
- May not be operated by someone under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- Violators will face up to a \$100 fine and up to 90 days in jail

Stay to the Extreme Right of the Road ONLY with the Flow of Traffic

Keep Them Clear

If there's a fire hydrant near your house, please do your part to keep it accessible this winter:

- → Remove any snow and ice
- →Clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work (about 3 feet)
- →Clear a path from the hydrant to the street.

Weekly Refuse may be placed at . the curb after 6 p.m. the day prior to collection. Trash Receptacles should be removed from the curb no later than Noon the next day.

Carbon Monoxide Prevention

To ensure a safe and cozy winter this year, the National Fire Protection Association offers some easy tips to follow:

- ▲ Use your oven to cook food only. Never use it to heat your home.
- ▲ Hire a qualified professional to clean and inspect heating equipment and chimneys every year.
- ▲ Turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- ▲ Place a sturdy screen in front of your fireplace to prevent sparks from flying into the room, and burn only dry, seasoned wood. Allow ashes to cool before disposing them in a metal container, and ensure that they are kept a safe distance from the home.
- ▲ If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.
- ▲ During and after a snowstorm make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
- ▲ Test smoke alarms and Carbon Monoxide alarms monthly. Properly maintained alarms can save lives in the event of a fire.
